Proposal for Consideration: Closing and Consolidating Four Elementary Schools in 2025-26

In this proposal, Sanislo, Stevens, Sacajawea, and North Beach would close and merge with a neighboring school. This would keep school communities together and create strong, merged schools.

How Consolidation Ensures Educational Excellence

By consolidating schools, SPS will enhance students' access to educational resources, while strengthening our financial stability. These resources include:

- Advanced learning, arts, music, and STEM opportunities
- Expanded social-emotional and mental health access and support
- Comprehensive special education services

Criteria for Closure and Consolidation

- **Building Condition**: Each school's structural and system quality was rated; these scores range from 1.00 to 5.00 with 1.00 meaning 'excellent' and 5.00 meaning unsatisfactory.
- **Learning Environment**: Schools were assessed for suitable, flexible learning spaces that meet educational and safety needs; 1 = Excellent, 5 = Unsuitable.
- Capacity to Serve Students: Schools were evaluated on their ability to support SPS standards for classroom size, special programs, and essential resources.
- **Regional Needs**: Regional enrollment trends and proximity to neighboring schools were considered to minimize disruption and support full consolidation.
